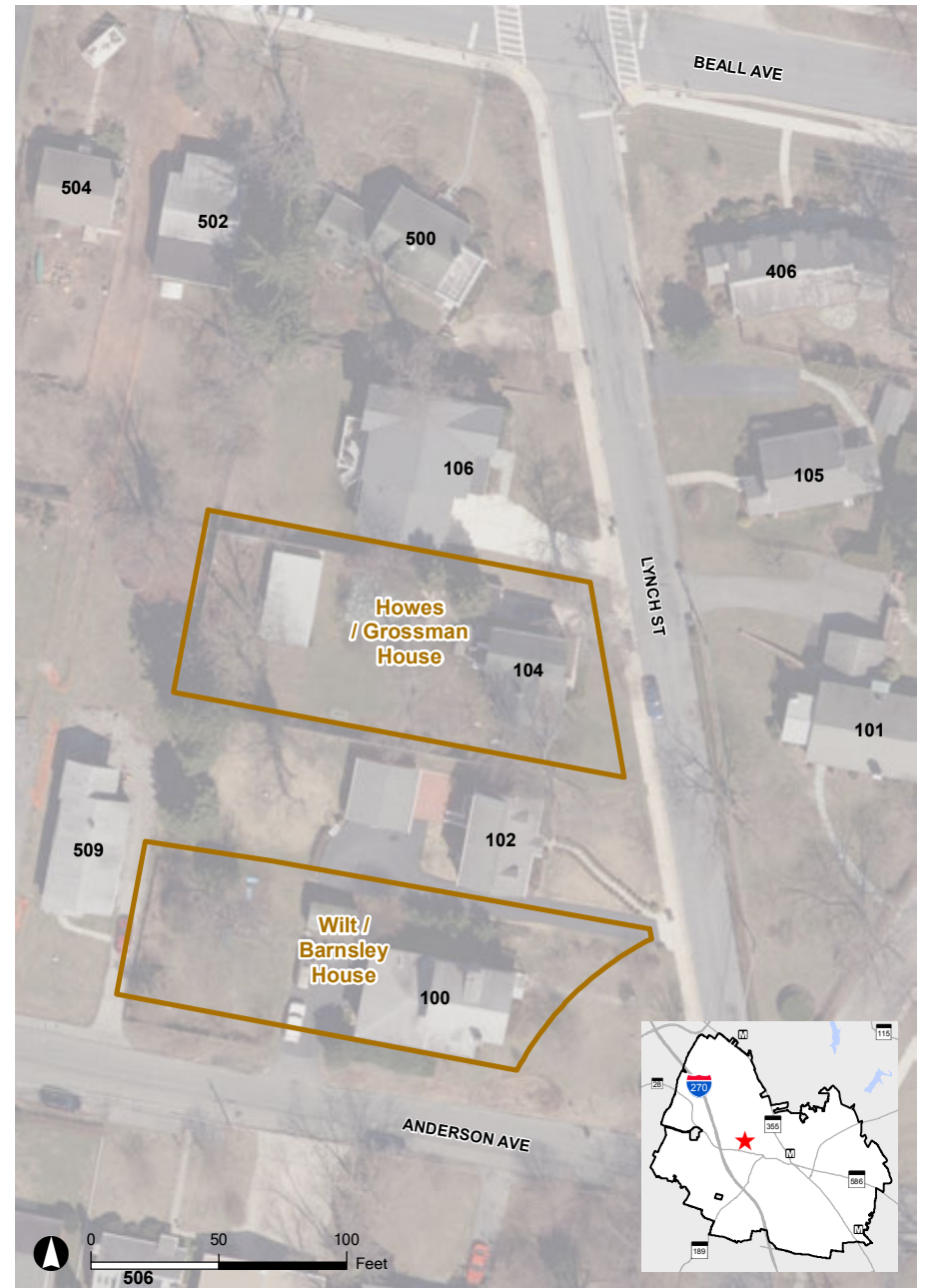


Howes-Grossman House

104 Lynch Street



The 1904 Howes-Grossman House was built by Harry Howes, identified as a builder and carpenter in census records. In 1926 the Howes sold the property to brothers Israel and Samuel Grossman. They were among the first Jewish residents in Rockville and the owners of Grossman's Market from 1920 to 1960. The commercial buildings of early 20th century Rockville were razed as part of Urban Renewal, and the houses of the merchants are the only remaining structures reflecting this aspect of small town life. The house contains Queen Ann elements such as fish scale shingles in the gables, cut-away bay window, and vertical massing.
