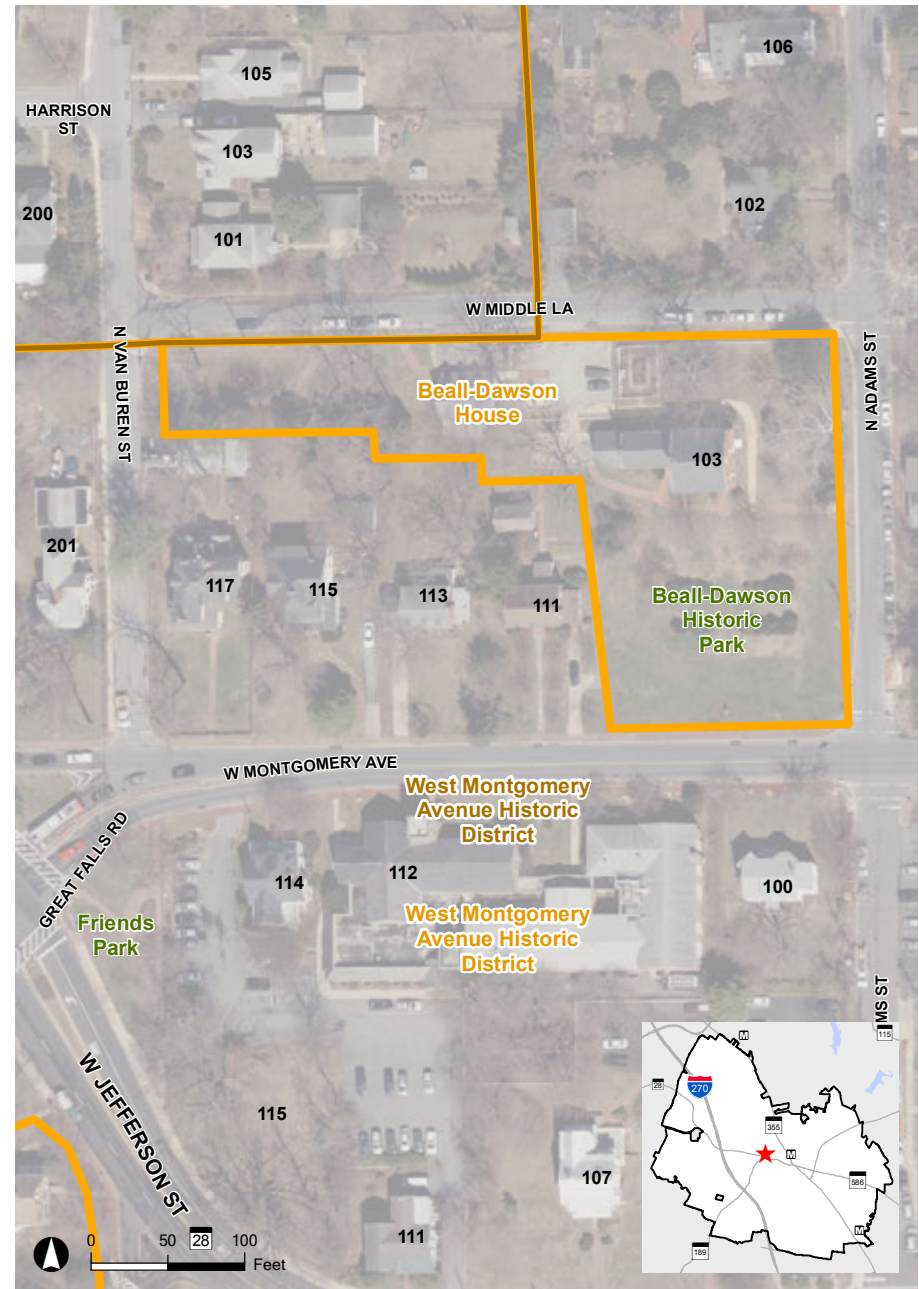


# Beall-Dawson House

103 West Montgomery Avenue



The Beall-Dawson House is an 1815 Federal-style home built by Upton Beall, one of the first Clerks of the Montgomery County Court. Two chimneys on either end of the 2 1/2 story main home are indicative of the Federal style, with gable end walls rising higher than the roof line to make a roof curtain with squared brick corbels at the north and south. The house is one of only a few structures still standing significant to the early heritage of Rockville. Today, the house serves the community as the headquarters of the Montgomery County Historical Society which maintains a library and exhibit in the building.
